GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

(Applicable to all Exhibitors)

1. Competition is open to the residents of Greenlee County and students of the Greenlee County Schools. Virden residents can participate in the Greenlee County Fair, but their entries will not be eligible to be sent to the State Fair. Display of articles is permissible where room is available.
2. Livestock, poultry, rabbits and all 4-H entries must be on file with the secretary one week before the opening day of the fair to assure adequate space. Not for horse show; enter Saturday morning.
3. Every exhibit shall be entered in the name of the owner.
4. No article or animal may be entered in more than one lot number with exception of special events.
5. **Only one entry may be made in each lot number by an individual exhibitor except the "Other Than Classified" lot, which has a maximum of two different entries by one exhibitor.**
6. The "Other Than Classified" lots are intended to accommodate exhibits for which there are no lot numbers listed. Exhibits eligible to show in classes and lots listed in the premium book will not be accepted in the "Other Than Classified" lots. A separate classification will be made in the event of three entries of a kind.
7. Special Regulations govern each section. Please read them carefully.
8. Exhibitors will be responsible for transportation of exhibits to and from the fair.
9. Premiums will not be paid on any animal or article not left on display during the fair. Horses in the 4-H, FFA and Open Horse Show are not required to be on display after the show.
10. The Greenlee County Fair Association reserves the right to amend or add to these rules as it, in its judgement, may deem advisable. The commission reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard there to or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incident to the fair.
11. No exhibitors can act as a judge in a class in which he showing.
12. The association will take every precaution to insure care and protection of exhibits but will accept no responsibility for losses or damage to any exhibit or to any person.
13. **OTHER THAN 4-H, SCHOOL EXHIBITS AND HEAD START ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE PREPARED BY JUNIOR EXHIBITORS AGES 14-17 AND PHOTOGRAPHY AND WOODWORK ONLY.**
14. Those wishing details regarding rental fee and allocation of commercial space near or inside the exhibit building should contact the Fair Commission at 359-2032 or 359-9037.
15. Since the County Fair is an education endeavor and a show case for the county wealth and produce, exhibitors are asked to enter the best they have.
16. **It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to agree with the Section, Class and lot that their exhibit has been entered in and will not be changed without the Superintendent & exhibitor both agreeing upon before the exhibit is left to be judged.**

HEALTH REQUIREMENT

The Greenlee County Fair Association, 4-H, FFA, GCYLA and the Greenlee County Livestock Association will not be responsible for the health of livestock brought to the County Fair or for the transmission of disease to an exhibitor's herd, flock or livestock after the County Fair. Swine may not originate from a head under quarantine for any disease. Swine may be required to be tested for Pseudo-rabies before entering the Greenlee County Fair. The Greenlee County Fair Association accepts no responsibility for any animal entered in the Greenlee County Fair.

ENTRY REQUIREMENT

1. Livestock, poultry, rabbits and all 4-H entries must be on file with the secretary on week before

the opening day of the fair.

2. The exhibit Building will be open to receive exhibits at the Fair grounds from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday and 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. on Thursday.
3. All entries are made with the understanding that in no event will the Greenlee County Fair Association become responsible for loss or damage that may occur to any animal or article.

JUDGING

1. Judging of all livestock will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Friday. Judging in the exhibit building will begin at 5:30 p.m. on Thursday.
2. All 4-H, FFA & GCYLA fat beef, fat lamb, and fat hog and showmanship classes to be judged by the Danish system. A grand and reserve champion to be selected in each category.
3. In any lot where there is no competition, judges will award ribbons according to the merit of exhibit, and the premium money will be paid accordingly. A maximum of ten cash awards will be paid in any section to one exhibitor on exhibits where there is no competition.
4. It is suggested that judges make comments on their placing for those who are interested in watching, SPECTATORS ARE REQUESTED TO REFRAIN FROM ANY COMMENTS OR IN ANY WAY TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION OF A JUDGE WHILE EXHIBITS ARE BEING JUDGED.
5. A judge may award a special merit ribbon on any outstanding exhibit that he deems worthy of special recognition and for which no other special award is offered.
6. When it is obvious to the judge that two or more exhibits are identical (as from the same cooking kettle, pot, etc.) The judge will be allowed to automatically discard one or all entries.
7. All judges will be selected by the Association and the placing of judges will be final.

RELEASING EXHIBITS

1. All exhibits shall be under the complete control of the superintendent and cannot be removed until the close of the show on Sunday at 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and with the approval of the superintendent. Horses in 4-H, FFA and Open Horse Show are not required to be on display after the show.
2. Exhibitor's tag stub must be presented to the superintendent before the exhibit can be removed.

SECTION SUPERINTENDENT

1. Superintendents shall be in charge of their section not later than 9:00 a.m. Thursday preceding the opening day of the fair.
2. **Their duties shall be to:**
 - A. See that the space assigned to their section is properly prepared to receive exhibits
 - B. See that all exhibits accepted by them have been properly entered and have a correct entry tag attached. Exhibits that have been erroneously entered by, at the discretion of the superintendent be transferred to their proper lots, previous to judging.
 - C. Supervised placing and arranging of exhibits in their section.
 - D. Check to see that all general and sectional rules are properly observed by exhibitors.
 - E. Have sufficient number of assistants available, as needed.
 - F. Keep a record of the judge placing as made in the judges record book provided by the fair secretary. Have judges books and ribbons separated and ready for show. (Superintendents may not in any manner try to influence the judges decision.) He must see that all awards are properly entered therein, as it is upon the record that the premium are paid. This record must be signed by the official judge and Superintendent and turned over to the fair secretary as soon as completed.
 - G. Superintendents shall be in charge of their section no later than 2:00 p.m. on Sunday to

- prepare the release of exhibits at 2:30 p.m.
- H. Superintendents, except School Section, shall return the folder containing the exhibitor's official entry forms to the exhibit supervisor after exhibits have been released.
3. The Superintendent may at his discretion require an affidavit of any exhibitor regarding ownership or other regulation set up in the rules.
 4. Any recommendations for changes or improvements for the next fair should be submitted by the superintendent to the Secretary of the exhibit supervisor at the close of the fair.

DEPARTMENT V

COMMERCIAL EXHIBIT

NOTE: Each exhibitor must abide by the following rules:

Commercial exhibits will be judged on general attractiveness, originality, theme produced as a result of said exhibit. Judging will take place Friday afternoon.

Exhibits must be in order no later than 12 noon, Thursday, No exhibits shall be removed before 2:00 p.m., Sunday.

If booth is not decorated and utilized, no refund will be made. Booth space will be resold.

All booths must be paid in advance. There will be no refunds or cancellations.

An exhibitor must work with the adjoining booths. If he or she creates a disturbance or interferes with the rights of others in any form, they will be required to refrain and give up their booth.

Each booth must provide a committee to arrange and place the exhibit and provide for a representative to attend the exhibit during the entire fair.

The Fair will take every precaution to protect the exhibits but still not be held responsible for loss or damage.

If electrical requirements are in addition to existing facilities, they will be furnished at cost of lease hold.

All judges will be selected by the Fair and the awards of the judges will be accepted by the entrants. In the event of a dispute, the decision of the Fair Association will be final.

All Birds must be recognized by the American Poultry Association or American Bantam Association with the exception of egg production and meat pen classes. On meat pen all entries must be acceptable meat type animals and they must be all of the same type and uniform in coloration.

POULTRY ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

1. ALL ENTRY FORMS MUST BE ON FILE WITH THE SECRETARY ONE WEEK BEFORE THE OPENING DAY OF THE FAIR.
2. All exhibits must be in place and recorded by the superintendent by 6:00 p.m. on Thursday.
3. All exhibits just be raised by exhibitor. Owner must furnish proof of ownership if requested by the superintendent.
4. The fair commission will provide coops for feeding, cleaning and general care of birds will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.
5. Any specimen showing evidence of vermin and/or disease will not be accepted.
6. Birds entered as single cannot compete as trios, nor birds entered as trios compete as single entries.
7. The term Cock and Hen shall apply to birds over one year old. The term Cockerel and Pullet shall apply to birds less than one year old. A trio consists of one male and two females of any age but same breed and variety.
8. No substitution will be permitted except in the same breed, age, sex, and class as original entries.
9. The Superintendent reserves the right to reject any entry not conforming to the rules. This is also a disqualification.
10. Jungle Fowl will be accepted. Fighting game will not be accepted.
11. All exhibits will be under the complete control of the superintendent until the end of the fair.
12. Judging will be by comparison. In lots where there is no competition judges shall award ribbons according to the merit of the exhibit. Unworthy exhibits will no be placed for awards.
13. Premiums will be awarded on each recognized breed eligible to compete in its class. Separate classes will be provided for each breed.
14. BEST DISPLAY: Must show at least one cock, one hen, one cockerel, one pullet, and one trio. All to be on the same breed and variety.
