
Rules and Regulations

- All work must be the sole work of the exhibitor. No pre-made purchase items.
Kits are acceptable.
- All entries must have been completed within 2015-2016.
- Exhibitors are responsible for deciding on the proper Division and class for each entry.
- All youth individuals who are showing under a group need to be a member in good standing to be eligible to enter under specified groups.
- Homeschools must use a last name plus the words “home school”
- The Fair does not assume any responsibility for entries and does not insure against loss or damage from the time from receiving to releasing dates.
- Judging is closed to the public. Information on judging will be available after the Fair opens.
- No live animals are permitted for exhibit in the building exhibit department
- Poster exhibits should be displayed on standard 22”x28” poster board or on a tri-fold 44”x28” cardboard display board. Foam boards are also acceptable
- Greenlee County Fair is a family oriented fair. Nude, obscene or violent entries will not be displayed, but will be accepted for judging at the discretion of the Department Superintendent. Management and judges reserve the right to remove entries, which are considered obscene or harmful to minors as defined in the Arizona Criminal Code Title 13 in the A.R.S.

In this department we have Youth: age 5 – 12, Teen: age 13 – 18, Adult: age 19 + and Person(s) with Disabilities.

Be sure to indicate the correct division on your entry form.

If exhibitor is less than 18 years of age, include your age and your parent signature where indicated.

Failure to comply with these rules may result in entry disqualification of the entry.

*** The Culinary Arts Department and the GREENLEE County Fair are *not* responsible for entries remaining after Sunday, September 18, 2016 4:00 pm.**

Read Rules carefully:

1. Exhibitors **cannot** be Professional; there is a separate category for those individuals.
2. Entries must have been prepared after the 2015 GREENLEE County Fair.
3. Exhibitor is responsible for determining proper Division and Class of entry.
4. Product labels must be securely attached to the back of the entry form.
5. The Culinary Arts Department reserves the right to remove *and* dispose of foods showing signs of spoilage.
6. Displaying exhibits:
 - Entries must be inserted into a clear plastic bag and sealed with a ziplock or twist - ties. Attach entry tag to the plate or pan.
 - Candies / Cookies: exhibited on a sturdy disposable plate.
 - Six candies per plate
 - Six cookies per plate (cookie dia. up to 3")
 - Put iced cookies in see through plastic boxes, not bags
 - Put cakes in see through plastic boxes, not bags
 - Pies exhibited in a sturdy disposable pan.
 - Breads / rolls exhibited on a sturdy disposable plate. Enter whole loaves of bread.
 - No mini loaves accepted.

7. Containers:

- Jars: standard canning jars identified by the manufacturer name on the container.
- *Do Not* use half - gallon jars or mayonnaise jars.
- Use caps and seals free from rust or scratches ~ preferably new
- Screw rim must be loosened but not removed.
- Seal must be tight and intact for judging.
- Jellies: in standard jelly glasses or standard half - pints with lids. Do not use wax.
- Canned products - meat - fruit – vegetables: exhibited in pint or quart canning jars.
- Canned goods must be clearly labeled and free from stickiness.
- Labels: placed on the bottom of each jar, should show date made and name of product.
Do not include exhibitor name on labels.
- Items not labeled will not be accepted.





Skill-A-Thon

Greenlee County Skill-A-Thon Rules and Regulations

The Greenlee County Skill-A-Thon is a hands-on competition that rewards outstanding young people who possess the skills and knowledge essential for efficient and humane production of livestock in a seedstock or commercial operation. Open to any 4-H, FFA or GCYLA youth, the contest provides the opportunity for youth to apply their knowledge to a variety of topics related to the production and management of beef cattle, swine, sheep and meat goats. Participants compete within multiple, age-appropriate categories including: feed identification, breed identification, equipment identification, quality assurance, retail/wholesale meat identification, livestock part identification, skeletal part identification, and livestock evaluation.

CONTEST FORMAT

This contest is open to all Greenlee 4-H, FFA, and GCYLA members between the ages 9 and 18. All ages are as of January 1st of the current year.

1. This contest is for both individual and team contestants.
2. Each division will consist of individual and team rotations. The divisions are required to complete the following: Junior and Senior: eight (8) individual rotations and one (1) team rotation.
3. Individual rotations include: a. Junior: Sheep, Goat, Beef, Swine (breed ID, exterior part ID, wholesale part ID), Equipment Identification, Quality Assurance, Feed Identification, and Livestock Evaluation. b. Senior: Sheep, Goat, Beef, Swine (breed ID, exterior part ID, skeletal part ID, retail meat cut ID), Equipment Identification, Quality Assurance, Feed Identification, and Livestock Evaluation.
4. Team rotations include: Livestock Practices.
5. Rotations that will be utilized in the contest will be posted and announced at check-in.

The Senior Division will consist of teams with any member fourteen (14) years old or older on the January 1, 2016, and no older than nineteen (19) on the January 1, 2016. For individual placing, the division of the team will also be the division of all individuals on that team. It is recommended to NOT enter Junior age contestants on Senior teams since those Junior age contestants will be placed as Senior age contestants.

6. A team score consists of the three highest scoring members and the score from the team activity. The fourth contestant will be eligible for individual awards.
- 7. TEAM AND INDIVIDUAL AWARDS WILL BE PROVIDED FOR JUNIOR AND SENIOR DIVISIONS.**
8. Coaches nor any other adults will not be permitted to examine rotations prior to completion of evaluation by contestants, unless invited to serve in an official capacity by 4-H Extension Agent, or Fair Director.
9. Contestants cannot confer with each other or their coach at any time during the individual rotations of the contest. Youth contestants need to understand that they will need to be silent during the individual rotations. Talking is permitted amongst team members during team rotations. Violators of this rule will be disqualified. Clean notebooks are allowed. Questions must be directed to Contest Officials only.
